


Activity



Divide family into two teams. Give each team a copy of the scriptures listed, a copy of the standard works and a bag to put their “treasures” in. Each team looks up the first scripture and reads it carefully to discover what they need to find that will fit into their sack. 1. Beat the first four ingredients together. 2. Mix in the remaining ingredients.
3. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto a greased cookie sheet. 4. Bake at 350° F for 15 minutes.

ANSWERS: 3/4 cup butter (softened), 1/3 cup milk, 1-1/2 cups sugar (sweet cane), 2 eggs, 2 cups flour, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon baking soda (leaven), 3 cups oats, 1 cup raisins.



Lesson

Have you ever wondered how it would feel to have the Savior, Jesus Christ, look into your eyes and smile or place His hands upon your head and bless you? How would His voice sound?
