












 Each of those pictures can remind us of blessings we receive from **Heavenly Father for belonging to Jesus Christ's Church.** • One of these blessings is when

we are baptized.








Remember at the end of last weeks lesson, Alma had escaped from the servants and the wicked King Noah.

Let's discuss what happened next.




The Story of Alma Baptizing in the Waters of Mormon

Alma escaped from King Noah's servants and hid for many days.


While he was hiding, he wrote down what the prophet Abinadi had taught.


Alma repented of his sins and went to the **Nephites** secretly, teaching them Abinadi's message.

During the day Alma hid in a pocket of trees near a pool called the Waters of Mormon.






Those who believed Alma's teachings went to the Waters of Mormon and were baptized.

• Alma ordained priests to teach the people.




He told the priests to teach repentance and faith in Jesus Christ. He also said they must not argue but be united.



Alma's people loved and served one another.


 They shared everything they had and were grateful to have learned about Jesus Christ, their Redeemer.

God warned Alma that King Noah's army was coming.




 The people gathered their families, animals, and other belongings and fled into the wilderness.


The Fourth Article of Faith

- "You're concerned about Wally, aren't you, Tim?" his father asked.


- "When we heard about the earthquake, we were concerned.

- He prayed for Wally's safety.




He asked his Heavenly Father to help him know that Wally was alive and well.

- He knew all was well.




- Finally a letter arrived assuring the family that Wally was safe.




 Enos was Jacob's son. He kept the plates and wrote on them after his father died.

God told Enos that because of his faith in Jesus Christ, his sins were forgiven.






 Enos also wanted the Lord to bless the Lamanites.


Even though the Lamanites fought the Nephites and tried to destroy their records, Enos prayed that they would become a righteous people.





 Enos prayed that the records he had kept would be safe


 The Lord promised that someday he would give the Lamanites the teachings that were on the records.
